we would like to invite you to this year's Diabetes Symposium to be held on September 23. This year's topic is the Typology of Diabetes in the Young. With increasing obesity, the clinical presentation of diabetes in childhood and adolescence is not always clear-cut. Today we are faced with decisions as to whether a patient has type 1, type 2 or even mixed diabetes.
